NOVICE CLASSES - CONDITIONS

1. A Novice is a Horse or Pony which has yet to win six Firsts in Conformation Classes at any A & P Show, at the time of the Show.
2. Once a Horse or Pony has had six wins it is not eligible for Novice classes.
3. Novice in Paced and Mannered classes is a Horse or Pony which has not won more than six Firsts in Paced and/or Mannered classes at any A & P Show at the time of the Show.
4. Novices may enter Open Classes.
5. Hacks: Any Lady's or Gentleman's Hack class win counts as an Open Conformation win.
6. Novice Champions are not eligible for Open Championships unless they have won an Open class, nor are they eligible for Supreme Award. Championship Award does not count as a win.
7. Novice Horse and Ponies must be shown in SNAFFLE BITS only, in Novice Classes, (excepting Harness classes).
8. If a Novice has gained six wins at the day of the Show, the Competitor must advise the Secretary's Office and may change to Open Class, or, if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned at such time as the Show Committee decides.

CHAMPIONSHIP JUDGING

- * Horse Championships will be judged from the conformation classes only.
- * The first placed winners being judged for champion.
- * Second placed to the champion to be judged alongside the remaining winners for reserve champion judging.

This Show supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' System.

A Yellow card will be issued, In cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behavior as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rule book, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 working days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences, Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' System is available to view on the RAS website - www.ras.org.nz.

Clean Sport - The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand apply. Competitors are advised that tests may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

Arrears - No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show/Event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

Summary of RAS Resolution Process - the full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the individual the complaint is being made about holds any of the following positions the complaint should be directed to the RAS CEO who will facilitate the necessary process (if the complaint is against the CEO send it direct to the RAS President) i, District Personal - any person who holds a position at district level - councillor (this includes a District Chair) or management (this includes District Manager/Secretary/Treasurer) ii. RAS personal - RAS Executive member, HSC Executive member, UBS Executive member iii. RAS Equestrian Judge iv, RAS management level. Height Certificates must be carried, No certificate no Judging.

Protective headgear: A hard hat is generally described as a hunting cap, a bowler, protective hardware or a safety helmet. Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on,

working in or schooling, or riding for any other reason a horse at an A&P Show or in any area considered to be for whatever reason a part of the showground. It is required that all riders particularly those jumping horses wear protective headgear conforming to the current NZ Safety Std or an equivalent Std and that the headgear be secured by a retention harness. No penalties will be incurred for those riders wishing to use approved safety helmets in showing classes. All riders must wear protective headgear secured at the shell at more than two points. Headgear must be worn with chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened. Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current Safety Standards. The latest list can be found at www.ras.org.nz
