ENTRIES – Close 15th February 2019, all late entries will incur a 50% penalty. Enter online at www.showday.online.co.nz

YARDS – There are a limited number of yards available, priority will be given to those travelling a distance out of the area. They are \$15.00 per night and must be left clean and tidy.

TRAVEL OVER 200KM – For those competitors travelling over 200km to attend the show they will be offered free yarding and a waiver of the \$12 Administration fee. Please note the 200km limit will be strictly adhered to and an address is required upon entry to validate this offer, otherwise full fees payable.

BACK NUMBERS - Number holders are encouraged to be used by all competitors using the appropriate number that the Show issues. Those who require a back number, they will be available from the Horse Secretary.

MANURE/HAY – Please ensure all hay and manure is removed from float area and yards.

Please Note:

1. All competitors and exhibitors ride and exhibit at their own risk.
3. Information re safety helmets.
4. Boundaries for our District.
5. All ridden horses/ponies must be 3 years of age or over.

*** Ring judging will commence at 8.30am, unless otherwise stated.**

*** Measuring - for a TMC for District Competitors only - will be available on the grounds from 7.00am until 7.30am only, please indicate when entering if a TMC is required.**

(1) HEIGHT CERTIFICATES AND MEASURING:

Where height is a requirement of the Section and RTR Hunters, exhibitors must carry an official RAS Life or Horse/Pony Annual Height and Performance Card, or South Westland A&P Assn Temporary Measuring Certificate (TMC). Failure to do so will result in elimination. **Measuring for a TMC is for South Westland A&P Show District Boundary Competitors**

only, will be available on the grounds. Only horses/ponies presented in a bridle and under suitable control will be measured for a TMC, at the times stated above.

(2) FS TESTING:

Forbidden Substance - The rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand regarding Forbidden Substances apply.

Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible risk. Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

(3) NOVICE CLASSIFICATION

A Novice is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in conformation classes at any A & P Show at the time of the Show (Ladies and Gentleman's Hack class wins count as an Open Conformation win and must be recorded). If a Novice entry has gained 6 wins by the day of the Show, the Competitor must advise the Horse Secretary's Office and may change to an Open class within the Sub-Section, or if no class remains to enter a refund which will be actioned after the Show. A Novice Hunter is a Horse or Pony which has not won 6 firsts in Round the Ring Hunter Jumping.

Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. Horse/Pony height and performance cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

Central Districts of the RAS collates all A & P Show results to enable Secretaries to keep a record of all Novice wins.

Novices may enter the Open Classes.

All Novice Horses and Ponies to be ridden in a snaffle bit.

It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two (2) official "S" identification badges. One attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two (2) RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. "S" badges are to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; armbands are available from RAS Head Office. Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz vest at Shows/Events when outside the show ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

(4) DISTRICT RULE

Horse and rider must reside in District to compete in District Classes.

(5) OWNERSHIP

All horses and ponies entered in competitive classes or ring events or parading must be in the name of the bona fide owner. All animals must be named at time of entry.

(6) LEASES

Leases or partnerships must be for no less than a six-month period and shall commence and must be lodged with the RAS.

(7) HATS AND SAFETY HELMETS

From the 1st of August 2017 all equestrian riders, including harness drivers must wear approved safety helmets. The standards can be found at the following link:

Helmet compliance is the responsibility of the rider/parent.

RED TAGGED HELMETS ARE MANDATORY FOR ALL RIDERS WHEN MOUNTED. NO RED TAG - NO ENTRY INTO THE RING - NO EXCEPTION

(8) All ring classes are run under RAS rules

(9) An Administration fee of \$12 per competitor/family is payable that helps cover the cost of judges travel and accommodation, RAS levies and competitor ground fees.

(10) The committee has the right to amalgamate classes if insufficient entries.

(11) If fewer than three entries in a class, then only second prize money will be paid out.
