If requested by the Assn exhibitors must furnish a declaration that the sheep are eligible, by reason of age, to compete in the class for which they entered.

Judges will be instructed not to award prizes to sheep which they consider unfairly shorn or excessively coloured, also to disqualify sheep on which an adhesive substance, string or other material has been used for the purpose of concealing or altering any defect in the fleece or the form of the sheep.

All prize winners to pick up their prize voucher and money from the Class Steward. In Natural Condition Class, exhibitors will be required to sign the declaration in Rule 40 of the General Rules and Regulations.

Exhibitors are reminded that the use of bloom dip or artificial colouring is now covered by Government regulations.

Shearing Conditions - For all sheep other than Merinos (merino shearing date under section conditions), no sheep shall shown in the wool shall have been shorn earlier than 20 July 2018. No rams shown in the wool shall have been shorn later than 1 March 2018. No ewes shown in the wool shall have been shorn later than 1 January 2018, excepting ewe hoggets which shall have been shorn no later than 30 January this year.

Unless otherwise stated all wool/dual purpose wool breed sheep in the shorn classes must be machine shorn on or after 20 July in the current year and no later than 28 days before the date of the show. all shorn terminal (meat) breed sheep classes to be close, evenly and fairly machine shorn on or after 1 September 2019.
